GAS LINE INSTALLATION

The following gas installation policy was approved by Council November 9, 1994 as per Motion 1297: **DEFINITIONS:**

Adequate Support:

A devise that could be connected or attached to a structure such as a

building, fence or blocks, that may be used to support a gas line and

associated facilities;

Developed Area:

An existing development; an approved subdivision and/or development;

or where municipal services may already exist, such as water distribution, sewage collection, power and roads, in a part of a

municipality;

Development Agreement:

An agreement between the Town of Manning (municipality) and a developer of land for the provision of certain municipal services,

including gas service, pursuant to the provisions of the Province Of

Alberta Planning Act:

Flexible Hose:

A hose that is flexible and that is used as a gas line connector to a

building

1. From the property line to the dwelling requesting gas line installation, a minimum fee of \$175.00 or \$3.50 per foot, whichever is greater, will be charged for new gas line installations.

Motion #6230, April 25, 2001: From the property line to the dwelling requesting gas line installation a minimum fee of \$200.00 or \$4.00 per foot, whichever is greater,

will be charged for new gas line installations.

Motion 6799 Aug 26, 2002:

When a property owner has completed his own trenching for the installation of a gas line, and the Town Gas Utility has approved the trenching, a minimum fee of \$200.00 or \$2.00 per foot, whichever is greater, will be charged.

Gas services will be installed to the property line at the Town's expense, or in the case of an approved subdivision and/or development, at the expense of the developer.

- 2. Outside a developed area, gas service may be provided at the discretion of the Town.
- The Town may include the provision and installation of gas service to a developed area as part of a 3. developer's agreement.
- Approved flexible hose will always be used to connect a mobile home to a gas meter. The 4. flexible hose expense will be paid for by the customer as part of the installation cost.
- If a mobile home is too far from the gas meter to be connected with only a flexible hose, the rest 5. of the connection can be steel pipe which shall be adequately supported.
- Flexible hose shall be connected directly to the gas meter.
- Homeowners will be encouraged to take steps to ensure that a gas line is adequately protected and visible to the public, as approved by the Town.
- Adequate protection, other than the building itself, shall be installed on all gas meters that are 8. further than 1 meter from a dwelling.
